CHILDREN'S BIOME BOOK DIRECTIONS & OUTLINE

Objective: Using the information you researched, write and illustrate a fictional children's book highlighting specific information about the biome.

Some things to think about...

- 1. Your book should actively tell a story while it passively teaches the reader about the biome. Find a way to share all your knowledge without turning everything you know into statements.
- 2. Your illustrations have the important role to add details about your biome without having to actually state the details in the writing. For example, the illustrations could show the terrain, weather, producers of the biome, or other consumers interacting in the background.
- 3. Your book should have a moral teaching and a happy ending. It should be appropriate for a young child.

Some ideas to get you started...

- * Animal friends could work together to stop human interactions from destroying their biome.
- ★ Animal friends help a newcomer fit into the biome, find mutualistic and commensalistic relationships, and stay away from parasitic ones.
- * Animal friends help a newcomer navigate through the area and prepare for a special weather event or special feature of the biome.
- ★ Animals get lost in their biomes and have to work together, use the features of the biome, and landmarks to find their way back.
- \star Have other ideas? Talk them out. Make a solid plan. Then, tell your teacher your idea.

Details that must be present...

The location of your biome
The terrain
weather conditions, rainfall, temperatures, etc.
Three different kinds of producers
Three different kinds of consumers (a primary consumer can be shown as a bunny
nibbling a flower)
At least one apex predator
one human interaction
At least two species interactions
